Homework Policy and Expectations

- Home reading and sight words are an essential aspect of student learning and development.
- Your child will benefit from 15-20 minutes of reading per night.
- Additional homework will be based around an opt-in model (online form sent out via Schoolbytes).
- Spelling words program will commence in week 3
- Weekly homework will include: spelling words, handwriting and reading.



Student Folders

- Students are encouraged to take their home reading folder to and from school each day. This will support them to:
- Collect notes
- Change their home reader/sight words
- Store passwords
- Things to keep an eye out for...
- Login passwords
- Spelling Words





200 Nights of Reading

- Commenced in Week 3.
- Students have been given a home reader and a reading log book to take home. Parents are asked to fill out one box per day if the book is read regardless of how many times the book was read.
- Home readers can be returned and exchanged for a new book.
- Home reading is aimed at developing your child's confidence and love of reading therefore books are aimed at their independent reading level.





200 Nights of Reading

- Students are encouraged to read each night. This might include reading to an adult, reading with an adult or listening to an adult read.
- 50 nights book mark
- 100 nights pencil
- 150 nights wrist band
- 200 nights special reward from Ms AJ





- Literacy Pro takes your child through a journey of literacy discovery **at their own pace**. It works on the Lexile Framework.
- The Lexile Framework finds the right books for students by measuring readers and texts on the same scale. Lexile measures are the global standard in reading assessment and are accurate for all ages, including first and second language learners.
- Lexile measures help educators and students select books at a level that will challenge them not so difficult as to be frustrating, but difficult enough to encourage reading growth.
- Your child has access to hundreds of e-books to read via the Literacy Pro platform at home and at school. Most e-books als include a comprehension quiz for your child to complete.

Reading Eggs

Learning to read can be easy and fun! Reading Eggs is an online reading program that helps children learn to read. Hundreds of online reading lessons, phonics games and books for students who are reading up to a PM level 26.

ABC Reading Eggs makes learning to read interesting and engaging for

kids, with great online reading games and activities. And it really works!

Children love the games, songs, golden eggs and other rewards which,

along with feeling proud of their reading, really motivate children to

keep exploring and learning.





Assessment and Reporting

- Assessments will be conducted throughout the term and teaching and learning will be adjusted to ensure your child is engaged and challenged in their learning.
- A formal report will be sent home at the end of each semester.



Communication

- School Bytes is our main form of immediate communication with parents and the community. The app will send out electronic notes, the Grapevine Newsletter, reminders of events, cancellations and important information.
- The school Facebook page is regularly updated with student achievement to be celebrated.
- Please email or call the school if you need to urgently contact your child's class teacher. Please email your child's classroom teacher with any questions or concerns. In line with the Department guidelines, teachers are expected to acknowledge receipt of the email within 3 days of receiving it and respond within 20 days.

Fruit Break

- Please remember to send your child to school with some fruit or vegetables each day for fruit break.

Parent Helpers

- Stage 1 teachers encourage parents to volunteer in their classrooms.
- If you would like to volunteer, as a legal requirement of volunteering in schools, parents and grandparents are required to provide 100 points of ID, complete an Appendix Declaration Form at the school office and a Working with Children Check. This only needs to be completed once which the office will then keep on file.
- As a volunteer you are also required to sign in at the front office on your arrival. You will be provided with a volunteer badge to wear for the duration of your stay. This allows us to know who is working in the school in case of an emergency.



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Special Celebrations and Excursions
