
This term we are running an Attendance Initiative 'Coco's Amazing race'!



Attendance rate % - Include partial days





Homework Policy and Expectations

- Homework will be based around an opt-in model.
- A Term Reading Challenge will be handed out starting next week.
- Homework activities will be accessible to students via the Valentine Homework Hub.

- Daily reading and Times Table practice is highly recommended for students in Stage 2. This will remain a vital aspect of student learning and development.
- Compulsory speaking task in class, twice a year. (Term 2 and 4).





Home Reading Challenge

In order to encourage reading each night in Stage 2, we are running a Reading Challenge. Students who reach the goals throughout the year will receive an award. We ask that parents sign to verify the number of nights your child has read. Students to bring in their home reading card back to their teacher at the end of Term 1.



Term 1 home reading goal: 40 nights.

Expectations:

Year 3: 10 minutes per school night $-(10 \times 5) \times 8 = 400$ minutes

Year 4: 15 minutes per school night – $(15 \times 5) \times 8 = 600$ minutes

While this is not compulsory, it is highly encouraged as regular reading practice assists students in all areas of learning. Thank you for your assistance in encouraging this important skill in our students.

Home reading awards:

50 nights = bronze award

100 nights = silver award

150 night = gold award

matific

- Matific takes your child through a journey of maths discovery <u>at</u> <u>their own pace</u>.
- Matific features hundreds of playful interactions called 'episodes'. Your child will enjoy playing the episodes for hours, learning maths in a process of guided self-discovery.



- Literacy Pro takes your child through a journey of literacy discovery <u>at their own pace</u>. It works on the Lexile Framework.
- Lexile measures help educators and students select books at a level that will challenge them not so difficult as to be frustrating, but difficult enough to encourage reading growth.
