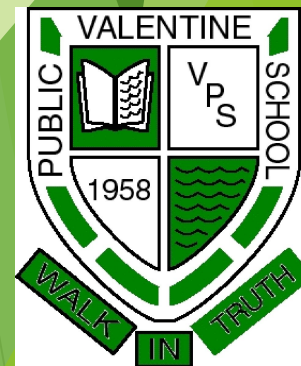

- The Learning and Support Team can also assist in the identification of high potential and gifted students who may require additional adjustments and extension.



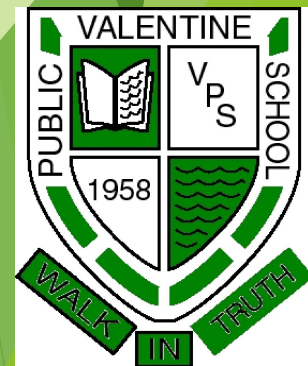

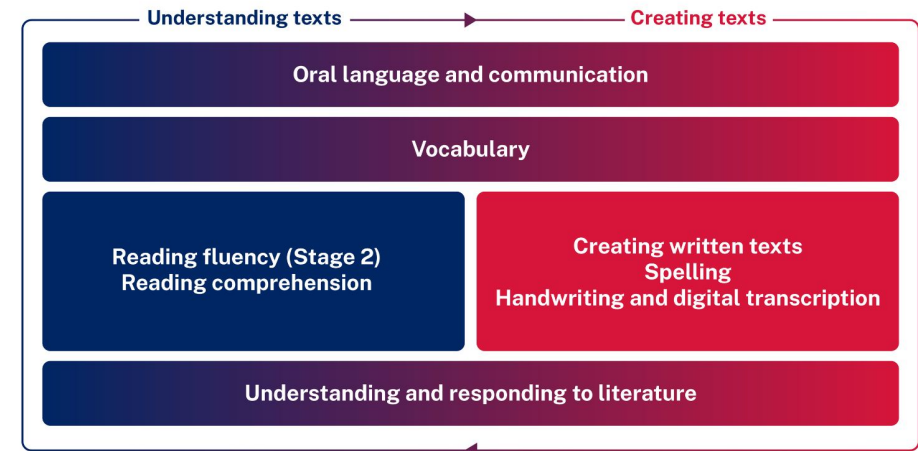

The new Mathematics syllabus clearly shows essential learning and supports students to make connections across concepts as outlined in the research for building foundations in Mathematics. There is a focus on developing reasoning skills to support a deeper understanding.

Content is structured to highlight the parallel connections across Number and Algebra, Measurement and Space, and Statistics and Probability, underpinned by the latest research.

Teaching advice for Mathematics includes examples to support the development of language and vocabulary. This will be particularly helpful for early-career teachers.

Vocabulary knowledge influences the development of reading, writing, oral language and Mathematics skills.

The new syllabus affirms the strong evidence base of outcomes and content, with an increased emphasis on place value.



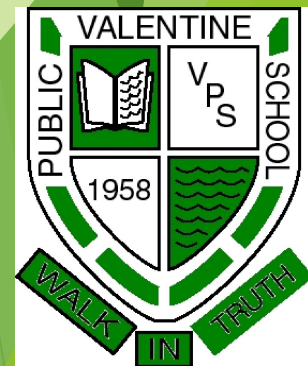
Assessment and Reporting

- Parent teacher interviews will be held in **Week 6, Term 1.**



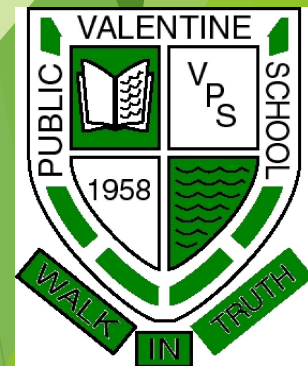
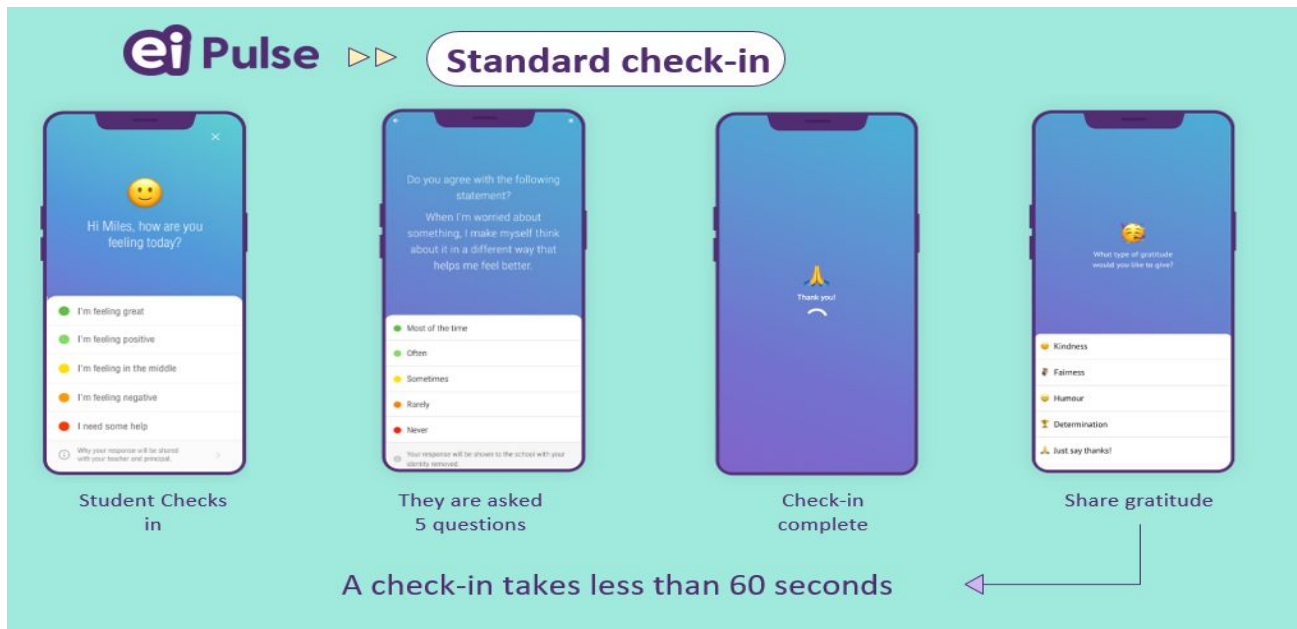
HPGE

- The Academy is an initiative to Valentine PS, and it was launched in 2023.
- Addresses the Department's new HP&G Policy, where high potential and giftedness are divided into four domains: Intellectual, Creative, Social and Emotional, and Physical.
- Provides opportunities for students to engage in enrichment, extension, and at times, acceleration opportunities in the classroom where high potential or giftedness has been recognised.
- Allows students the chance to track and recognise their progress across the four domains in their school and personal lives.
- Offers opportunities, using an online platform, to ensure all students have equitable access to those opportunities from any classroom.



Pulse

- **E.I. Pulse** is a tool used for measuring the week-to-week wellbeing and engagement of our students at Valentine PS. It tracks the wellbeing of individual students so that the school can respond to those who express a need.
- Pulse also tracks anonymised student sentiment about their engagement with the school so the school can make changes based on student voice.
- Students check in once a week, or more frequently, if they need.

Camp Readiness

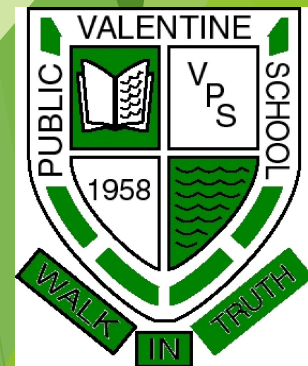


- Our school camp structure normally builds a child's confidence during Years 3-6 to ensure students are well prepared to stay away from home for 3 nights when in Year 5-6.
- School camps feel quite different to family holidays, particularly at night. Most children naturally feel some sense of homesickness at this times. This is completely normal and teachers are very experienced at supporting students if this occurs. Teachers are NEVER in bed early on school camps!
- If you feel your child may not be accustomed to staying away from home for three nights without family, we highly recommend you organise a number of sleepovers for your child throughout this year, particularly at homes they are not frequent guests at (i.e. NOT a grandparent's home).
- As always, please speak with your child's classroom teacher if you have any concerns or further questions. Where possible, we encourage ALL students to attend school camp, as it is certainly an experience they will fondly remember forever.

- Daily reading and times tables practice is highly recommended for students in Stage 3. This will remain a vital aspect of student learning and development.
- Compulsory speaking task in class, twice a year (1 per semester).



Homework Option



- Literacy Pro takes your child through a journey of literacy discovery **at their own pace**. It works on the Lexile Framework.
- The Lexile Framework finds the right books for students by measuring readers and texts on the same scale. Lexile measures are the global standard in reading assessment and are accurate for all ages, including first and second language learners.
- Lexile measures help educators and students select books at a level that will challenge them - not so difficult as to be frustrating, but difficult enough to encourage reading growth.
- Your child has access to hundreds of e-books to read via the Literacy Pro platform at home and at school. Most e-books also include a comprehension quiz for your child to complete.



The Importance of reading at Home

We encourage all Stage 3 students to read 20 minutes a day as regular reading practice assists students in all areas of learning. Thank you for your assistance in encouraging this important skill in our students.

Stage 3 Reading Challenge:

- * All students will receive a reading log card this week.
- * Students are encouraged to read every night for 20 minutes and record this on their reading log.
- * Teachers will ask students to bring their reading log in on Friday Week 5 and Friday Week 10.
- * If students have completed 40 nights of reading by Friday Week 10, they will receive a reward for their efforts.

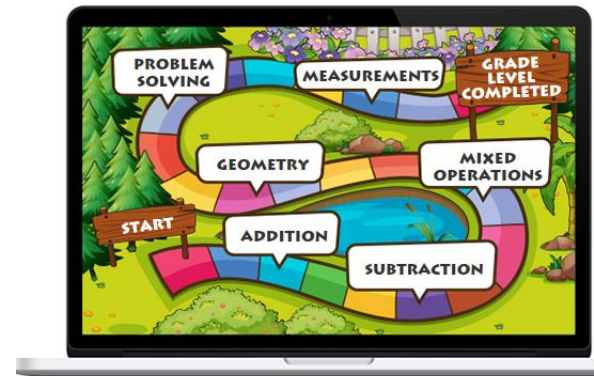

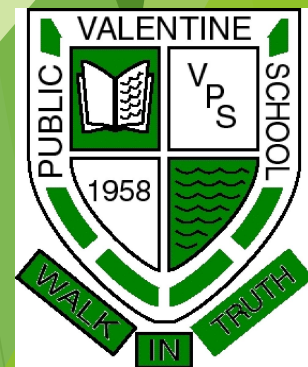

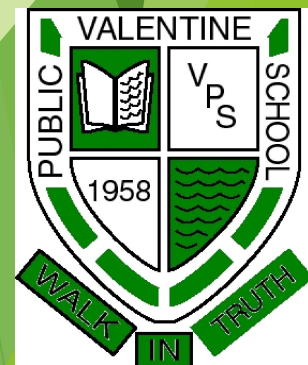

Students must read and sign the BYOD Student Agreement in the company of their parent or caregiver unless otherwise directed by the principal.

Please read the following carefully, by signing this document, you are agreeing to the points below:

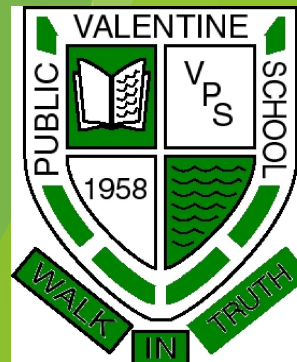
- I agree that the use of my device and my use of the Department of Education's internet will only be on the directions given by the teacher.
- I agree that mobile phones are not part of the VPS BYOD program.
- I will not take my device into the playground.
- I agree to take my device home each night.
- I endeavour to fully charge my device at home but can have access to a charging station in the classroom if needed using my own charger.
- I will use my own portal/internet log-in details and never share them with others or strangers.
- I will not hack or bypass any hardware and software security implemented by the Department or my school.
- I will not use anyone else's personal device.
- I will not use my own device to knowingly search for, link to, access or send anything that is: offensive, explicit, threatening, abusive, defamatory or considered to be bullying.
- I will report inappropriate behaviour and inappropriate material to my teacher.
- I understand that my activity on the internet is recorded and that these records may be accessed by my teacher or principal if required.
- I acknowledge that the school cannot be held responsible for any damage to, or theft of my device, and that I alone am responsible to ensure the safekeeping/safety of my device at all times.
- I understand that the school provides access to the DoE's filtered wireless network and those devices which access other networks must be disabled whilst on school grounds.
- I understand that my device can be confiscated if the school has reasonable grounds to suspect that it contains data, or is being used in such a manner, which breaches the BYOD Student Agreement.
- I understand that there will be consequences if my device is not used appropriately, as per the VPS BYOD Student Agreement.



BYOD

Students MUST:

- Be safe, responsible and respectful users of digital devices, online platforms, and support their peers to be the same.
- Respect and follow school rules and procedures.
- Communicate respectfully and collaboratively with peers, school staff and the school community.
- Behave in the ways that reflect our school values of Connect, Respect and Inspire.
- Use devices only for educational purposes as outlined by the class teacher.
- Endeavour to bring a fully charged device to school every day.
- Ask their teacher for permission to charge a device at school if necessary.



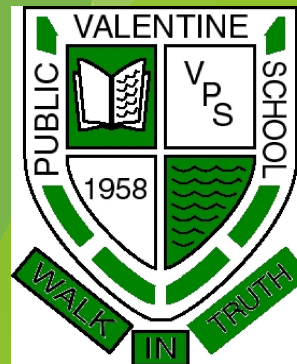
Technology- Helping to Keep Our Kids Safe

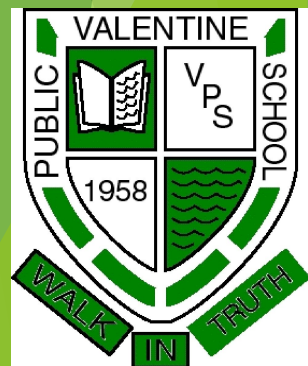
